The bid letting for the Gateway Park and South Main Street Trail Extension Project was held via Zoom on Thursday, April 1, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. Three bids were received: Bacon Concrete LLC for \$99,748.11, Eastern IA Excavating & Concrete, LLC for \$122,728.76 and Ethan Koehn Construction for \$157,639.84. A letter was received from Project Manager, Jon Biederman with Fehr Graham, recom-mending that the City tentatively award the construction contract for the project to Bacon Concrete LLC per their proposal subject to obtaining signed easement documents.

8) Ordinance No. 414-21 Amending the Code of Ordinance of the City of Monona, Iowa, by repealing Chapter 69, Section 09, Subsection

9) Consider Placement of New Stop or Yield Signs in Gordon Subdivision

At previous regular meeting, the City Council decided they needed clarification of where exactly Public Works director, Randy Evanson, felt the signs needed to be placed. After some more discussion it was moved by Wright, seconded by Elledge to have a yield sign in-stalled at the south end of Jim Burger Blvd, on the west side and at the north end of Council Street on the east side. Both signs would yield traffic turning onto Darby Drive. Carried Unanimously.
10) Consider Fixing Three Spots

on Jim Burger Blvd. and Darby

At the recommendation of Public Works director, Randy Evanson, the council discussed whether to fix one spot located on Jim Burger and two spots on Darby Drive, where there have been some heaving/ soft spots every spring. Evanson felt that these spots needed to be fixed, at an estimated cost of around \$3,000.00, before Kluesner Construction started their asphalt overlay on those two streets. It was moved by Elledge, seconded by Landt to get the three spots fixed before the resurfacing project later this year. Carried Unanimously.

11) Approve Appliance and Electronic Drop-off Day Request Adam Schnuelle agreed to take appliances and electronics during a 3-hour time for free. He is unable to take televisions and monitors this year. The Winneshiek County Landfill said that they currently have some room for televisions and monitors at a cost. After some discussion it was moved by Landt, seconded by Wright to set Wednesday, May 5, 2021 from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. as the date and time for the City Appliance and Electronic Drop-Monona residents only can bring appliances and electronics to 104 S. Egbert, gravel parking lot across from the Community Center. The residents are responsible for loading their items onto a trailer There is no fee for the appliances

and electronics but there will be a \$25.00 fee for each television and monitors. Carried Unanimously 12 Consider Annual Contribution to Clayton County Community Col-

laboration Council A letter was received from the 5C Coalition asking for financial support from the city. In the past it was the city's understanding that the projects the 5C Coalition initiate

and coordinate across the county use to be part of the Substance Abuse Services for Clayton County. The city had already pledged an amount to Substance Abuse Services for Clayton County assuming that the Hidden In Plain Sight Exhibit, Escape Room, Driving Simulator, and other projects were still part of their program. With regret the council felt that they were un-able to approve a funding donation to the 5C Coalition for this upcoming fiscal year 2021/2022 but highly recommends the group to submit a new letter at the end of 2021 re-

questing financial support for the budget of 2022/2023.

13) 2021 Post Office No Longer Offering A Free Box to Certain

Monona Residents Lori Shatek, with the Monona Post Office, informed the city that due to a regulation change, the post office would no longer be able to offer free post office boxes to an estimated 130 residential homes in Monona The change affects homes located outside a quarter mile of the post office. She wanted to ask if the city would consider putting up cluster boxes for affected residents on either Main or Iowa Street. After much discussion on the subject, it was moved by Elledge, seconded by Landt, for the city to not get involved in issues regarding the Unit-ed States Postal System. Carried Unanimously.

14) Looking at Hiring a New Police Officer

The Monona Police Department ran an ad looking for a full-time police officer. The ads ran for two weeks. Two applications were received, and one interview was done by the Monona Police Board and Police Chief. Upon completion of the interview the Police Chief and board recommended the hiring of a new police officer. After some discussion, it was moved by Elledge, seconded by Schlein to approve the hiring of the new officer. Carried Unanimously.
