The Luana City Council held their regular monthly meeting Thursday May 5, 2022, at 7:00 pm. with Council Members Lonnie Baade, Kevin Boddicker, Todd Olson, Jackie Radloff-Schneider, Luke Steege present. Absent: None.
Mayor Jerry Schroeder called meeting to order at 7:00 pm.
Minutes of April meeting were reviewed and approved upon a motion by Radloff-Schneider, second by Steege, carried unanimously.
Olson motioned to pay all monthly claims totaling \$38,261.05, Radloff-Schneider second, carried unanimously. Receipts for the month totaled \$41,260.82. Steege motioned to pass Res. 5-2022 T.O.F, Baade second, carried unanimously.
Brian Bugenhagen, Garms Financial Services, reviewed the cities current insurance policy with the council. Policy premium increased by 11% over last year. Bugenhagen stated with the city having no claims really helped with the low increase compared to other policies. City shop coverage was discussed. No dividend check will be issued this year. Consensus of council to leave current policy as is.
The Mayor announced that this was the time and place for the public hearing and meeting on the matter of the 2022 Budget Amendment at 7:23 pm. The Mayor then asked the Administrator whether any written objections had been filed by any City resident or property owner to the proposal. The Administrator advised the Mayor and the Council that no written objections had been filed. The Mayor then called for oral objections to the proposal and none were made. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the time for receiving oral and written objections to be closed. Steege motioned to adopt and pass Res. 5-1-2022 FY2022 Budget Amendment, Boddicker second, carried unanimously. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the measure duly adopted.
Steege motioned to support MFL MarMac's Friends of the Arts in the amount of \$75, Radloff-Schneider

second, carried unanimously.
Administrator Humble shared letter from city attorney. Humble will follow up with attorney.
Administrator Humble informed council that KCRG TV9 will be featuring Luana, Monona and Postville in an upcoming "Our Town" series. They will be shooting footage on May 9th with the series being aired June 6-10th.

2) Hearing of Delegations
None
3) Approve MFL MarMac Dollars for Scholars Color Walk/Run for Hay Days
After some discussion, it was moved by Elledge, seconded by Meyer to approve the MFL MarMac Dollars for Scholars Permit to hold a color walk/run on Saturday morning, June 11th. Carried Unanimously.
4) Review FY2021-2022 Budget Amendment #1
Administrator Collins reviewed the status of the nine expense functions within the city budget. Budget Amendment #1 would be for an increase of expenses amounting to \$278,447.00. Most of the increase is due to an increase in liability and work comp insurance, the purchase of a new truck ordered over a year ago, the purchase of a new lawn mower, and the purchase of new flow meters for the pool.
5) KCRG Channel 9 ~ "Our Town"
Administrator Collins explained that there would be no cost to the city to be involved with "Our Town." KCRG does look to have three corporate sponsors for the segment, however, even if they have none, one or two they are still doing the segment. They will start shooting stories on May 9th and the "Our Town" segment that features Luana, Monona, and Postville will air the week of June 6th to 9th on the 6:00 a.m. news. KCRG will then continue with more coverage on the 4 and 6 p.m. newscasts. They will do one Facebook post per day. All stories will be posted on the "Our Town" page at KCRG.com.
6) Garbage Amnesty Day or Spring Clean Up Day
City Hall continuously receives calls from residents asking if there is a garbage amnesty day or Spring cleanup day. Since the city contracts out the garbage pickup, an email was sent to Town & Country (T&C) asking if they provide some type of "Spring Cleanup Day." T&C replied that they would supply 40-yard dumpsters at a cost of \$600.00 per dumpster (dump). City Administrator Collins suggested that if the council decided to go forward with a "Spring Clean-Up" Day that it be held at the same time as the city's Appliance and Electronic Drop-off Day. After much discussion on garbage, tree branches and leaves it was decided to make sure our next newsletter reviewed what is offered to residents regarding garbage, trees and sticks, compost material and the burning of leaves. Spring Clean Up Day will be addressed next year if not brought up sooner.
7) Mowing Inside the Swimming Pool Fence
Due to not wanting to get grass clippings in the pool filters, the grass inside of the pool fence, needs to be bagged. Currently the city does not have any mowers with baggers. Options were to hire someone to bag it, check on price to add a bagger to our new mower, or pur-

chase a push mower with a bagger. Between City Administrator Collins and Councilman Meyer more information regarding costs will be brought to the May 16th meeting.
8) Money for New Trees
Since the city did not receive the "Community Forestry Grant," public works director Evanson, asked if the council would consider approving the \$2,550.00 match, they had originally approved for the grant, to purchase four new trees at City Park and four new trees at Gateway Park. The council discussed types of trees and the location of where the trees would be planted. It was moved by Elledge, seconded by Schlein to approve the spending of up to \$2,550.00 for new trees at the two parks. The council would like to approve the type of trees and location at the next meeting. Carried Unanimously.
9) Chevy ½ Ton Truck Ordered in Early 2021
At the March 8, 2021, special council meeting, the council approved the purchase of a new 2021 Chevy ½ ton truck for the cost of \$25,900.00 out of the street capital equipment fund. Due to issues with parts, the truck was not built till 2022 and it came with a \$3,057.00 price increase. It was moved by Meyer, seconded by Elledge to approve the price increase of the new 2022 Chevy ½ ton truck. Carried Unanimously.
10) Sign on Main Street ~ Fred Hein's Property
At the April 18th meeting the council asked for more information regarding the sign that is located on Main Street, across from Quillins on Fred Heins property. Administrator Collins found the sign was originally constructed by members of the American Legion. Different organizations supplied their own signs to be put on the sign. Years later the Monona Jr. Feeders received a grant from a seed corn company to replace the all the signs with two metal signs for each organization that could be viewed from both directions. Fred Heins talked to City Administrator Collins and said that he was okay with the city taking over the sign and moving it to city property. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Meyer, to find a new location for the sign and a way to fund the moving and rebuilding of the sign. Carried Unanimously.

Doeppke moved, Keehner seconded tabling the signing of the 28EAgreement for Shared Maintenance Facility with the City of Garnavillo until it is reviewed by legal counsel and some areas of disagreement are corrected. Ayes: Doeppke, Keehner, Peterson. Motion carried.
Constructions plans for the new EMA building using ARPA funds were reviewed with Emergency Management Coordinator Sarah Moser. It is expected that the shell of the building and concrete work

will be completed by Fall 2022 with a June 2022 start. Water and sewer will be included in the building and it will be heated. The capacity to add solar energy is also planned. Moser requested a 28E Agreement between EMA and the County so that everything is in writing and all rights and responsibilities are understood.
Keehner moved, Doeppke seconded approving and placing on file the FY2021 First Judicial District Financial Report. Ayes: Doeppke, Keehner, Peterson. Motion carried.
