Voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before they may receive and cast a ballot. Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered such as voters registering to vote on election day - and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the County Auditor's Office by June 6, 2022 at 12:00 PM. Election Day Registrant attesters must provide an approved form of identification. Absentee ballots are available beginning May 18th in the Auditor's Office located at 111 High St NE in Elkader. Voters may vote in person through 4:30 PM on Monday, June 6, 2022. The deadline to request an absentee ballot to be mailed is Monday, May 23, 2022. All absentee ballots must be

received by 8:00 PM on Election Day to be considered on time to be counted. A voted absentee ballot may NOT be turned in to the polling place for counting; however, the voter or the voter's designee may bring the ballot to the Auditor Office's by the time the polls close on Election Day.
