A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) may 1) have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the County Auditor's Office by November 8, 2021 at 12:00 PM. Election Day Registrant attesters must provide an approved form of identification. Voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before they may receive and cast a ballot.

Absentee ballots are available in the Auditor's Office located at 111 High St NE in Elkader where voters may vote in person through 5:00 PM on Monday, November 1, 2021. The deadline to mail absentee ballots has passed.

All absentee ballots must be received by 8:00 PM on Election Day to be considered on time to be counted. A voted absentee ballot may NOT be turned in to the polling place for counting; however, the voter or the voter's designee may bring the ballot to the Auditor Office's by the time the polls close on Election Day.
