Monona Chamber Director, Rogeta Halvorson, presented the council with a 2020 third quarter report. The chamber is currently working on finishing up the Gateway Park Playground Project. City workers will be installing the recycled plastic benches this fall. Ron Hill donated his time towards building the new trail kiosk in Gateway Park. The Chamber is also working on the 2020 Christmas Shop Hop. Due to COVID-19 there will be no vendor fair or house walks. The Scouts will be doing a pick-up only pancake breakfast on December 5th with Santa Claus making an outdoor appearance from 8 a.m. to 12 noon.

7) Approve Setting Public Hearing for SOO Green's Application for Transmission Franchise
